## Subject Matter/Background

The following summary relates to Resolutions 74-2021, 75-2021, 76-2021 and 77-2021. As submitted by Jason Gibboney, Water Superintendent:

The combined purchasing power of the City of Sandusky, the City of Huron the City of Vermilion, and Erie County in the purchase of water treatment chemicals allows for a decreased expense as opposed to the cost should each entity purchase the identical product on their own. Therefore, on behalf of the City of Huron and other entities, the City of Sandusky conducted a bid for the purchase of Water Treatment Chemicals and has provided all entities with the final bid tabulation indicating the apparent low bidders for each chemical. The City of Huron Water Filtration Plant will purchase a total of six chemicals from four vendors through this bid.

The final bid tab (attached hereto as Exhibit 1) provided by the City of Sandusky shows bulk amounts for each chemical, I have provided explanations of the estimated quantities which the City of Huron expects to use in 2022.

As a result of combined bids with the City of Sandusky, proposed chemicals are as follows:

Caustic Soda (Sodium Hydroxide) 25%	\$1.30/Gal	\$0.50 Increase from 2021
Chlorine Gas	\$.8733/LB	\$0.50 Increase from 2021
Fluoride (Hydrofluosilic Acid) 25%	\$2.23/Gal	\$0.11 Decrease from 2021
Sodium Permanganate	\$11.20/Gal	\$4.58 Increase from 2021
PAC (Powdered Activated Carbon)	\$1,898.00/Ton	\$333.00 Increase from 2021
ACH (Aluminum Chlorhydrate)	\$.625/LB	\$0.18 Increase from 2021

## Note:

It should be noted the expenditure and related costs for all treatment chemicals has been included as part of our 2022 operating budget. Also note that the bids for Aluminum Chlorhydrate Polymer from USALCO and Chemtrade were rejected for lack of comparative jar testing as outlined in the bid specification. In addition, the following estimates are simply educated assumptions based on prior use data. Actual system demands and lake conditions will determine actual amounts needed. Estimates are purposely inflated to assume one additional load per year as a safety cushion.

Awards for bids as follows:

**JCI Jones Chemicals Inc.**: For the purchase of 14 Tons of Chlorine in an amount not to exceed \$24,452.40 and 12,000 Gallons of Sodium Hydroxide at an amount not to exceed \$15,600.00. Grand total for this vendor is \$40,052.40.

**Applied Specialties:** For the purchase of 12,000 Gallons of Aluminum Chlorhydrate Polymer Blend at an amount not to exceed \$80,940.00.

**Bonded Chemicals Inc.:** For the purchase of 8 tons of Powdered Activated Carbon at an amount not exceed \$15,184.00, and 4,000 Gallons of Sodium Permanganate at an amount not to exceed \$44,800.00. Grand total for this vendor is \$59,984.00.

**Univar USA Inc.:** For the purchase of 6,000 Gallons of Hydrofluosilicic Acid at an amount not to exceed \$13,380.00.

Total Chemical cost(s) as listed above: \$194,356.40

## **Financial Review**

The 2022 budget includes the total cost not to exceed \$194,356.40 for chemicals. Although the total contracted amount increased by over \$40,000 from prior years, the actual annual costs for chemicals has historically been below the contracted amount. For comparison purposes, 2020 actual cost was approximately \$102,000 and 2021 projections are expected to be approximately \$105,000.

## **Legal Review**

The matter has been reviewed, follows normal administrative procedure and is properly before you.

## Recommendation

If Council is in agreement, motions adopting Resolutions 74-2021, 75-2021, 76-2021 and 77-2021 are in order.



## NASBP White Paper: Resident Agent Countersignature Laws Have Been Eradicated and Violate the Law in Every U.S. State

The purpose of this short white paper is to inform the reader that resident agent countersignature laws have been eradicated throughout the United States and its territories (with the exception of Guam, where it has not been challenged). Any bid, performance, or payment bond that requires a resident agent countersignature or a resident agent signature violates the law, as such requirements have been held unconstitutional by federal courts throughout the United States or have been repealed by state legislatures, because such requirements impermissibly favor licensed resident agents over licensed non-resident agents. It is not the countersignature requirement that is problematic; it is the *resident agent* countersignature requirement that violates the law.

The National Association of Surety Bond Producers (NASBP) is aware that officials in some state and local agencies are not informed about the illegality of resident agent countersignature mandates. These officials will improperly reject a bid based on lack of a required resident agent countersignature or improperly refuse to accept performance and payment bonds based on lack of a required resident agent countersignature. NASBP receives dozens of member requests each year to send comment letters to public agencies that have included the unlawful resident agent countersignature requirement in their surety bonds.

Countersignature laws date back to the early twentieth century when states passed the laws as a consumer protection measure. The regulations requiring non-resident agents to receive sign-off by a local resident agent were originally intended to ensure compliance with local insurance laws. Those regulations also meant that out-of-state agents had to pay local agents for their signatures. By the 1990s, technology made the countersignature laws an anachronism of regulation. The movement to repeal countersignature laws began in the 1990s and ended in 2008 when the Ninth Circuit struck down Nevada's countersignature law. This movement was spearheaded by The Council of Insurance Agents & Brokers.

One of the most well-known and widely quoted cases on this matter is *Council of Insurance Agents and Brokers v. Tom Gallagher*, 287 F. Supp. 2d 1302 (N.D. Fla. 2003), in which the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Florida struck down a Florida statute that impermissibly favored resident agents. The district court determined that there was no rational basis for a distinction between Florida licensed resident agents and Florida licensed non-resident agents and declared unconstitutional the Florida statute at issue that discriminated against Florida-licensed non-resident agents.

Agency officials may want to have the agency's bond forms reviewed to ensure that its bonds do not contain an illegal resident agent signature or countersignature requirement. The bonds should contain a licensed (resident OR non-resident) agent requirement.

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





#### **Subject Matter/Background**

This resolution ratifies the City Manager's execution of a License Agreement with Atlas Heavy Projects LLC relating to their use of the ConAgra property to offload goods from their container ship. # LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement ("Agreement"), made by between the CITY OF HURON, OHIO ("City"), and ATLAS HEAVY PROJECTS LLC, a Texas limited liability company ("Licensee") (with City and Licensee being individually referred to herein as "Party" and collectively referred to herein as "Parties"), is to EVIDENCE THAT:

WHEREAS, Licensee has requested the opportunity to moor a vessel on waterways adjacent and contiguous to City property and to offload, temporarily store, and move certain goods ("Goods") of one or more third parties from City property to recipients in the general area;

WHEREAS, the Goods will be temporarily held by Licensee on City property on an area depicted on Exhibit A (attached to an incorporated herein by reference)(the "License Area"), and, therefore, it is necessary for the City to grant a revocable license to Licensee to temporarily use the License Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is duly acknowledged by the parties, the parties here to agree as follows:

- 1. The City hereby grants a license to Licensee to temporarily use the License Area as set forth and described on Exhibit A, for use from October 25, 2021 (the Effective Date") until November 8, 2021 (the "Deadline") for a flat, one-time lump-sum rental fee of \$3,500.00. The fee shall be paid to the City on or before November 22, 2021). In the event Licensee he has not removed the Goods from the License Area on or before the Deadline, Licensee shall be obligated to pay the City the sum of \$350.00 daily for each and every day that the Goods remain on the License Area. The License Area depicted on Exhibit A shall exclude any other City-owned property not referenced thereon.
- 2. The City shall have the unilateral and voluntary option to revoke, terminate or modify this License on forty-eight (48) hours' notice in the event that the License Area becomes unavailable for use by Licensee as provided for by this Agreement or in the event of Licensee's breach of this Agreement.
- 3. Licensee will obtain, in advance of the mooring at Licensee's sole cost and expense, and provide proof of same to City as may be requested:
  - (a) all necessary security-related services as determined necessary by Licensee, and the City shall not be obligated to provide any additional security beyond ordinary police and fire protection available to all citizens of the City;
  - (b) all necessary site preparation, stabilization, and staging protections to ensure the License Area is safe, suitable, and stable for use as a staging/temporary storage area for the Goods and necessary transportation equipment, which License Area maybe inspected by the City Engineer prior to delivery of the Goods to ensure compliance with this Agreement, and the City Engineer may require additional materials be added to some or all of the License Area to ensure a stable staging environment with a suitable depth of stone or aggregate as directed by the City Engineer to withstand the weight of the Goods and transportation equipment;

- (c) any and all permits necessary or required by the Federal, State (including but not limited to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources), City, and all other local authorities and any and all related agencies requiring such permitting; and
- (d) The Certificate of Insurance referenced in Section 7, below.
- 4. Licensee will ensure all transportation equipment for the Goods utilize ingress and egress pathways as designated by the City.
- 5. Other than providing access to the License Area pursuant to this Agreement, the City shall be under no obligation whatsoever to provide any assistance, services, or materials to Licensee for any of Licensee's activities arising or contemplated by this Agreement. The City shall render a detailed cost statement for any and all assistance, services, or materials that the City determines is necessary to accommodate Licensee's use of the License Area. Without waiving the requirements of Licenses to comply with its obligations hereunder, including but not limited to Section 2(b) hereof, items which shall be provided and billed when and where required (as determined by the City) include, but are not limited to:
  - (a) The cost of materials to further improve and/or stabilize the Licensee Area (i.e., gravel, stone, etc.);
  - (b) The cost of City personnel to inspect and monitor the License Area from the Effective Date to the Deadline;
  - (c) the cost of safety and health-related forces if utilized;
  - (d) cost to repair, replace and/or remediate the License Area and adjacent and contiguous City property in the event of any damage or environmental contamination of same regardless of cause; and
  - (e) and all other cost, fines, fees, penalties, and charges incurred by the City as a direct result of Licensee's use of the License Area and adjacent and contiguous City property and for Licensee's breach of its obligations in this Agreement.
- 6. The Licensee agrees, at its sole cost and expense, to have the entire License Area cleaned and restored to the condition it was in as of the Effective Date not late than seven (7) business days after the Deadline, including removal of all site preparation and site stabilization materials.
- 7. The Licensee shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all actual or threatened actions, causes of action, claims, damages, demands, expenses, fees, fines, liabilities, losses, penalties, judgments, and suits for bodily injury, death and all property damage (including but not limited to environmental contamination as a result of Licensee's acts or omissions or those of its contractors) asserted by the City and/or any third parties, including but not limited to actions or causes of actions arising from acts, omissions, or reckless or wanton conduct directly or indirectly relating to any and all of Licensee and Licensee's contractors' activities relating to this Agreement, with such indemnification including all costs of defense, including reasonable attorneys and expert witness fees. Licensee shall secure general liability insurance, at least in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence, Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00) in the aggregate (including excess liability coverage); Owo Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for Property Damage, which policies shall name the City as an additional insured by endorsement, and shall provide a copy of the relevant Certificate of Insurance on or

before the Effective Date. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this Agreement, the City's receipt of a valid and accurate Certificate of Insurance is an express condition precedent to the City permitting use of the License Area.

- 8. Licensee shall furnish City with evidence that the required insurance referenced in Section 7 has been obtained on or before the Effective Date. But for the inclusion of this Section 8, City would not have entered into this Agreement.
- 9. Licensee shall ensure all contractors providing transportation services maintain liability insurance, at least in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) Bodily Injury; Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) Property Damage, which policies shall name the City as an additional insured and loss payee by endorsement and relevant Certificates of Insurance shall be provided to Licensee on or before the Effective Date.
- 10. Licensee shall refrain from using the parking lot at the Huron River Boat Access Ramp.

# **Subject Matter/Background**

This resolution authorizes an annual expenditure of funds for the purchase of rock salt. In accordance with a cooperative agreement with Erie County, and in conjunction with several local agencies, an advertisement for bids produced the recommended pricing for consumption in 2022. Attached to the legislation please find the Resolution No. 21-318 adopted by the Erie County Board of Commissioners, awarding the contract to Compass Minerals America, Inc. at a cost of \$45.00/ton delivered. This reflects an increase of \$0.80 per ton over 2021 costs (1.8% increase).

The current salt contract is with Compass Minerals America, Inc. @ \$44.20/ton delivered in effect until 12/31/21. We currently have \$25,000 encumbered for 2021 and \$23,000 spent as of 10/31/2021 (\$65,000 budgeted for 2021) and 125 tons of salt stored in inventory. Per the terms of the cooperative bid, the City of Huron has been allocated up to a maximum of 1,000 tons but only pays for those amounts requested up to the maximum.

### **Financial Review**

The purchase of salt out of the Street Maintenance Fund (Fund 212) is included in the annual budget. The 2022 budget will still reflect a budget of \$65,000, as the City historically budgets conservatively as a worst-case scenario. The City's annual average cost to purchase salt from 2017 to 2021 is approximately \$30,000 per year. The expectation is the Street Department will not pay more than approved in this resolution. If so, Staff will request Council approval to increase the dollar amount.



### RE-ZONING PROCEDURE OUTLINE AND APPLICATION Codified Ordinance Section 1131.03

When a completed application is received by the Zoning Department for a re-zoning within the City of Huron, the City Council will be notified at their next regularly scheduled meeting. City Council shall refer the matter to the Planning Commission for their review, consideration, and recommendation to the City Council. The Planning Commission shall be given at least thirty (30) days to report their findings and recommendation on the matter back to the City Council. The City Council shall then schedule a Public Hearing on the matter for their final decision and action on the application.

The following schedule and time table shall serve as a guideline:

- 1. Completed application, data, and fee received by the Zoning Department
- 2. A notification is submitted to the City Council at their next regularly scheduled meeting.
- 3. Notifications are sent out to the parties of interest as required in Section 1131.03 of the Codified Ordinances at least twenty (20) days before the Planning Commission considers the matter.
- 4. Planning Commission consideration and recommendation to the City Council (at least thirty (30) days from their (Planning Commission's receipt of the application).
- 5. Report and recommendation to the City Council at their (City Council's) next regularly scheduled meeting
- 6. City Council Public Hearing (at least thirty (30) days from their receipt of Planning Commission's recommendation)
- 7. City Council's final action on the request.

- (a) <u>Building Siting and Orientation.</u> Buildings shall be oriented in the most logical manner dependent upon the layout of the development as a whole. Elements such as proximity and vantage point of the river and lake, proximity to streets and ways, and access of public walks and other pedestrian amenities shall be taken into account. Buildings shall be oriented in a way to promote a fluid flow of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian-based.
  - (1) Entrance orientation. Entrances shall be clearly visible and identifiable from the street and delineated with elements such as roof overhangs, recessed entries, landscaping, or similar design features. The primary entrance must be placed along the frontage of any pedestrian or vehicular way. A secondary entrance is permitted in the case that the respective side of a building is adjacent to the waterfront and must also be identifiable by architectural design treatment.
- (b) <u>Uses</u>. Permitted, conditional, and accessory uses may occur within each building type as specified in Appendix A, Permitted Uses.
- (c) <u>Parking.</u>
  - This district is intended to promote pedestrian and bicycle access, with as little space taken up by parking surface area as possible ensuring quality urban design. Therefore, the incorporation of jointly used parking structures shall be utilized as part of a general development concept.
  - (2) Required spaces. The spaces within the district shall be determined based on the schedule set forth in Chapter 1133 Off-street Parking and Loading Regulations. In order to foster more dense development, the use of parking structures is permitted.
- (d) <u>Signs</u>. The installation and maintenance of signage shall be done in accordance with Chapter 1129 Sign Regulations and the provisions of this Chapter. Additional regulations include the following:
  - (1) Pole signs are prohibited.

- (2) Wall and projecting signs are encouraged. Projecting signs may be up to ten (10) feet in height on one-story buildings and fifteen (15) feet in height on two (2) or more story buildings. Signs must not project further than five (5) feet from the part of the building the sign is affixed to. All projecting signs shall be placed so that the base of the sign is at least ten (10) feet above ground level, except when the projecting sign is located above a landscaped area or other area that does not permit pedestrian or vehicular traffic beneath the sign, in which case the sign must be placed so that the base of the sign is at least six (6) feet above ground level.
- (e) <u>Landscaping.</u> The installation and maintenance of landscaping materials shall be done in accordance with Chapter 1131 Landscape Requirements.
- (f) <u>Sidewalks and Pedestrian Amenities</u>. Pedestrian circulation shall be addressed with the use of sidewalks and other modes of internal connections. Each general development concept within this district, shall have a pedestrian amenities plan. The plan shall include the following:
  - (1) Interconnected pedestrian plan that allows for continuous access to all uses within the development area.
  - (2) Indication of surface materials being used, which shall include visually attractive and durable, low-maintenance surface materials such as pavers, brick, or concrete.
  - (3) Streetscape design features shall be incorporated, including decorative lighting, benches, landscape materials and shade trees, and other architectural features highlighted within the Master Plan.
  - (4) Design specifications for all pedestrian amenities. Perimeter paths and pedestrian walkways should be a minimum of six (6) feet wide. Interior paths and pedestrian walkways shall be a minimum of four (4) feet wide, except when along the frontage of a building or structure which encompasses the main entrance, in which case the walkway shall be six (6) feet in width.
- (g) <u>Greenspace and Public Amenities</u>. Areas of lawn, trees, and other vegetation or artistic architectural structures set apart for passive recreational use or aesthetic purposes must be provided as part of a general development concept.
  - (1) Requirements. A minimum of two thousand (2,000) square feet of public greenspace must be provided for every one (1) acre of development.
  - (2) <u>Design.</u> Creativity is strongly encouraged within greenspace areas.
  - (3) <u>Location</u>. Ten percent (10%) of the green space shall be adjacent to the water front in order to maintain public access to the water front.
- (h) <u>Internal Streets and Vehicular Circulation</u>. Internal streets shall be constructed with curbs to define the limits of the roadway. Internal streets shall be constructed in the same manner as specified by the Thoroughfare Plan: Neighborhood Link. Streets shall be laid out in a system designed to minimize pedestrian and vehicular conflicts and to promote the fluid flow of traffic.
- (i) <u>Lighting</u>. Lighting shall be installed using a combination of attractively designed fixtures of varying heights throughout the development, including along pedestrian ways, along streets, and within parking areas to provide a safe, secure, and aesthetically pleasing development. Lighting within the district shall be employed in such a manner as to prevent glare or direct light onto adjacent residential property.

(j) <u>Curb Cuts and Access Points</u>. This district should be developed and planned with prioritization placed on pedestrian and bicycle traffic, with curb cuts and access points segregated as much as possible. (Ord. 2015-7. Passed 8-25-15.)

# 1127.10 VARIATIONS TO AN APPROVED GENERAL DEVELOPMENT CONCEPT.

- (a) <u>Minor Variations.</u> Minor variations from an approved General Development Concept may be approved by the Planning Commission upon finding that the variations are generally in keeping with the spirit and concept of the approved General Development Concept, in accordance with the conditions required by the City Council in its approval, and in accordance with the requirements of this Chapter. For the purposes of this Section, a minor variation shall include:
  - (1) Small, incidental alterations to the location or number of spaces in off-street, surface parking lots.
  - (2) Small, incidental construction of accessory structures;
  - (3) Incidental increases/decreases in the square footage of principal buildings. Any increase in the overall number of permitted dwelling units shall not be considered a minor variation;
  - (4) Minor alterations in the placement of dwelling units within a phase of the overall project;
  - (5) Minor design modifications that will have no discernible impact on neighboring properties, the public, or those intended to occupy or use the proposed development.
- (b) Other than Minor Variations. All variations contained on a development plan that are not described in this chapter shall be reviewed by the Planning Commission. If the Planning Commission finds that such variations are generally in keeping with the spirit and concept of the approved General Development Concept, in accordance with any required conditions, and in accordance with the requirements of this Chapter and this Code, the Planning Commission shall approve such variations.
- (c) If approval of any variations to a General Development Concept result in a necessary change to existing zoning or previously authorized development agreements, the Planning Commission must forward the revised General Development Concept and any relevant zoning amendments or revised development agreements to City Council for review and approval.
- (d) Upon receiving a recommendation from the Planning Commission for approval of any zoning amendments or development agreements necessary for the proper execution of a revised General Development Concept, the City Council will review the General Development Concept. Any zoning amendments shall be done in accordance with procedures spelled out within section 1139.03 of the Huron Planning and Zoning Code. Any development agreements shall be authorized in the manner of a Resolution.
- (e) Failure on the part of the Developer to conform to said plans included within the General Development Concept, and/or applicable Municipal requirements and/or the terms and conditions of the City's approval shall be grounds for action by the City.
- (f) Amendments to a General Development Concept. Amendments to a General Development Concept, whether by the original applicant or subsequent applicants, shall be submitted and reviewed in accordance with procedures set forth in this Chapter regarding Conformity to Standards, General Development Concepts, and Procedures for Approval. (Ord. 2015-7. Passed 8-25-15.)
